HAF 2016 Awards

Every year, the HAF presents various awards to selected filmmakers in recognition of the outstanding potential of their projects. The 14th HAF will give out a total of 14 awards, amounting to approximately HK\$1,478,500 (approximately US\$190,800) in cash and value in kind. These awards include:

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HAF Awards presented by Create Hong Kong, Hong Kong Film Development Fund and HAF. Two cash awards of HK\$150,000 each (approx. US\$38,700) were given based on the originality and creativity of the projects. The winners were *Vampire Diary* (Hong Kong, by Anthony YAN & Hang CHIU) and *The Third Wife* (Vietnam, by NGUYEN Phuong Anh).

iQIYI's Special Award presented by iQIYI. One cash award of HK\$100,000 (approx. US\$12,900) was given to encourage and support young film talents from the Chinese speaking territories. The winner was *Dying to Survive* (China, by WEN Muye).

HAF/Fox Chinese Film Development Award presented by Fox International Productions (Greater China). One cash award of HK\$100,000 (approx. US\$12,900) and a Development Contract with Fox were given to encourage the development of Chinese-language cinema. The winner was *Brothers* (Malaysia, by Jong YU).

HAF Script Development Fund, initiated by Ms. Sylvia Chang, the former Vice Chairman of The Hong Kong International Film Festival Society Limited, presented by Star Chinese Movies and the Hong Kong International Film Festival Society Limited. One cash award of US\$10,000 (approx. HK\$77,500) was given to encourage quality Chinese-language script. The winner was *Heaving Craving* (Taiwan, by Pei-Ju HSIEH & Jing WANG).

Wanda Film Award presented by Wanda Media Co. Ltd. One cash award of HK\$100,000 (approx. US\$12,900) and a Development Deal with Wanda were given to support a Chinese-language feature film project for its originality and creativity. The winner was *Lieutenant Yi* (Taiwan, by Renè LIU).

Fushan Documentary Award presented by Fushan Features. One cash award of HK\$100,000 (approx. US\$12,900) and development contract with Fushan Features were given to facilitate the development of documentary feature films. The winner was *Border Bride* (China, by WANG Bing).

Wouter Barendrecht Award presented by Wouter Barendrecht Film Foundation, Create Hong Kong and Hong Kong Film Development Fund to dedicated to the memory of the late Wouter Barendrecht, the renowned film producer and one of the founders of HAF. One cash award of HK\$50,000 (approx. US\$6,450) was given to a project with a director under the age of 35 and made not more than three feature films. The winner was *Inking a Last Masterpiece* (Japan, by UCHIJIMA Utsuke).

The Artention Film Award presented by Artention Films Corp. One cash award of HK\$50,000 (approx. US\$6,400) and priority entry into Artention Film Incubator (based at Artention's International Visual Arts and Film Centre) were given to encourage film projects that exhibit high artistic and commercial potential. The winner was *Dying to Survive* (China, by WEN Muye).

Paris Coproduction Village Award presented by Paris Coproduction Village. One in-kind award (round-trip ticket) of Euro 4,000 (approx.
